

Election-Related Cases FAQs

1. Where do I file an election complaint?

- In most cases a person wishing to make a formal complaint must file a written complaint with the Attorney General's office. The process and forms for doing so are found [here](#).

2. Where do I file an appeal to a ruling?

- If you have questions regarding filing an appeal with the New Hampshire Supreme Court, contact the New Hampshire Supreme Court Clerk's Office at 1-888-535-1946.

3. How do I contact the Attorney General's office with specific voter questions?

- Send an email to electionlaw@doj.nh.gov. Candidate campaigns may make complaints concerning alleged violations of election laws prior to, during and after an election by calling the Civil Bureau at (603) 271-3650 or the Election Hotline at 1-866-868-3703. 4. Who should I contact with general questions about election-related cases that have been filed?

6. How do I get access to hearings in election-related cases?
